



# Role

## Senior Project Development Manager

Manage the Development Team in Great Britain with the aim of developing new renewable energy projects (predominantly wind), from option signing through to gaining planning permission. This will involve contributing to the overall company development strategy and being accountable for the delivery of projects in the GB region, including specific project responsibility.

### Key Responsibilities

- Development Team resource management;
- Overall responsibility for the Development Team, to review work progress and report up to the Head of GB;
- Prioritise the project development funnel and assign project management responsibilities;
- Produce a development strategy for each project;
- Liaison with relevant planning departments for designated projects;
- Preparation of planning applications for designated projects;
- Managing external consultants and liaison with internal specialist teams;
- Arrange and attend local public consultations;
- Specialist input into parts of the environmental assessment reports prepared for each project;
- Liaison with statutory consultees and relevant licensing authorities;
- Assist the Prospectors with site selection and identification;
- Assist the Prospectors with liaison with landowners and lawyers over legal issues;
- Budgeting and budget-tracking; and;
- Participation in the development of the Company's Integrated Management System.

Please note that this job description is not an exhaustive list of responsibilities. The post holder is expected to carry out a variety of tasks which are consistent with those listed above.
